# 2022 TAX LAW CHANGES

## MILEAGE RATES

The IRS has announced special adjustments to better reflect the recent increase in our fuel prices to mileage reimbursement for the final months of 2022.

- Jan Jun 2022 = **58.5¢/mile**
- Jul Dec 2022 = 62.5¢/mile
- Jan Jun 2022,
  - Medical Deductible = 18¢/mile
- Jul Dec 2022 = 22¢/mile
- Jan- Dec 2022,

Charitable Mileage remains = 14¢/ mile

#### STANDARD DEDUCTIONS

- Single or Married Filing Separately \$12,950
- Head of Household \$19,400
- Married Filing Jointly \$25,900

## **EARNED INCOME CREDIT (EIC)**

The IRS requires us to obtain proof of residency for <u>each</u> child that qualifies for the credit. Acceptable proof includes school records, health care coverage or other documents that reflects the child lives at the same address as the parent.

\*\*ALL SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS ARE REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF YOUR APPOINTMENT TO ENSURE COMPLETE PREPARATION OF YOUR RETURN AND FILING. \*\*

As always, we like to remind our clients that the Tax Filing/Extension Request Deadline is APRIL 18, 2023. (NOTE: Penalties and Interest will still apply, even when filing for an extension).

Helpful tips for Taxpayers:

Setup an IRS account @ IRS.gov

The biggest advantage to creating an IRS account is **quick access to your personal tax data**. Once registered, you can access a wide array of your tax information.

Direct Deposit VS. Paper Check?

Taxpayers can receive their refunds and/or process tax payments electronically by providing their <u>Bank Account # and Routing Number</u> at the time of filing. Whether you file electronically or on paper, **Direct Deposit gives you access to your refund faster than a paper check**. Direct Deposit also avoids the possibility that your check could be lost or stolen or returned to IRS as undeliverable.
