	Earned Income Credit (EIC) The IRS requires us to obtain proof of residency for each child that qualifies for the credit. Proof includes school records, health records or documents that reflect the child lives at the same address as the parent.

- ✓ APRIL 15TH, 2025 is the tax filing deadline and extension filing deadline for INDIVIDUALS.
- ✓ MARCH 17TH 2025 is the tax filing deadline for PARTNERSHIPS, CORPORATIONS AND LLC'S TAXED AS A PARTNERSHIP OR CORPORATION. IT IS ALSO DEADLINE FOR THOSE COMPANIES TO FILE EXTENSIONS.
- ✓ Note: When filing an extension, penalties and interest will apply to tax amounts due.
- ✓ Filing an extension is only an extension to File <u>Not an extension to pay</u>.
- ✓ All supporting documents should be brought to your appointment to ensure timely completion of your Tax Return preparation and filing process.
- ✓ If you drop off your information after March 31st an extension will be filed for you. We cannot guarantee it will be done by the April 15th deadline.

<u>Create an IRS account</u> at IRS.gov to gain quick access to your personal tax data. There, you can access a wide array of tax information.

<u>Direct Deposit & Electronic Payment</u>: Taxpayers can receive their refunds electronically by providing their Bank Account number and Routing number at the time of filing. Also, if you have tax due you may choose to pay through electronic funds withdraw.

- ALL dependents must have Social Security Number and clarify if there is a different last name.
- _____ Did you receive tax exempt interest?
- _____ Did you receive any State tax refund during the year?
- _____ Did you sell stocks or bonds? If YES, will need to know the price you paid for them and how much you sold them for. You will also need to advise of purchase date and sold date.
- _____ Did you make any withdrawals from IRS, Keogh, or Tax deferred Savings Plan?
- _____ Did you sell, purchase, or refinance a home? If YES, bring the settlement sheet for the transaction. Please provide any

list of improvements made and the amount spent for them. Be sure to include the settlement sheet for the new house.

- This is only if you bought and sold within 2 years.
- _____ Did you do any home repairs that qualify for energy efficient credits?
- _____ Did you receive installment sale payments? If YES, we will need to separate interest and principal.
- _____ Did you receive a distribution from a retirement plan?
- _____ Did you or do you plan to make an IRA or Keogh contribution?
 - If YES, are you or your spouse currently in a retirement program at work?
- _____ Did you make payments for childcare?
 - If YES, please bring name, address & social security number or Employer ID Number for facility.
- _____ Did you suffer a casualty loss? If YES, please bring police or fire reports and insurance reimbursement.
- _____ Did you make estimated tax payments to the IRs or the State?
 - If YES, please bring the checks so that we can make copies for tax return.
- _____ Did you attend any post-secondary school? If YES, bring the 1098T amount paid even if paid by a student loan.
- _____ Did you purchase a vehicle or boat? If YES, bring in the amount paid for sales tax and purchase date.
- _____ Did you participate in Digital Assets or Crypto Assets (Crypto Currency or Digital Tokens)
 - If YES, please provide statement to show loss / gains
